Student demonstrated confidence in speaking.

<u>Content (Knowledge of Subject)</u>

Student established and presented research findings in an organized fashion (good categories, processes, etc.).				
Audience members conclude feeling informed about your topic and that they understand your topic.

Slides summarized information in easy-to-read formats (bullets,etc).				
Slides were helpful for following the presentation, but not a distraction.				
There was uniformity of style throughout the PowerPoint.				
Pictures and symbols were directly related to the content.
